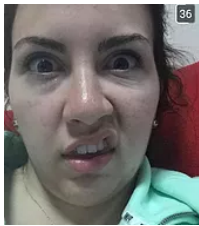

Welcome to a new Pioneer year! We are excited to get to know you and have a WUMderful time doing service this year! Here's a little about us.



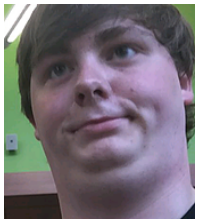
Kailyn Longueville - President

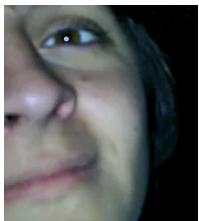
Jessica Wells - Vice President

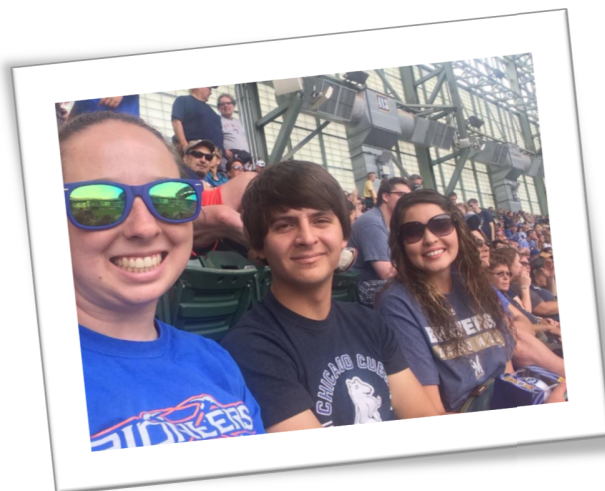
Summer Shenanigans
